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Supplier Code of Conduct for Jnoad Design and Construction Business

Introduction

Supplier Responsibilities

1. Compliance with Laws and Regulations

Suppliers must ensure full compliance with all applicable UK laws, regulations, Jnoad Public Policy ([Jnoad Limited - MEP Design Consultancy & Installation](#)), codes of conduct, including but not limited to:

- **The Health and Safety at Work Act 1974**
- **The Modern Slavery Act 2015**
- **The Equality Act 2010**
- **The Data Protection Act 2018 and GDPR**
- **Environmental Protection Act 1990**

Identification: Suppliers must conduct internal audits to confirm their adherence to these laws and inform Jnoad of any legal non-compliance.

Training: Suppliers should ensure their staff are regularly trained on the latest legal requirements affecting their business.

2. Ethical Business Practices

We expect all suppliers to conduct their business with the highest standards of honesty, transparency, and fairness.

Suppliers must not engage in bribery, corruption, fraud, or any other unethical conduct in their dealings with Jnoad , its employees, customers, or other third parties.

Identification: Suppliers must establish internal controls to detect and prevent unethical practices.

5. Environmental Responsibility

Suppliers are expected to minimize their environmental impact by adhering to all applicable environmental laws, such as the Environmental Protection Act 1990, and by adopting sustainable practices.

Identification: Suppliers must identify and manage environmental risks, including waste management, emissions, and resource consumption.

Training: Suppliers should train their workforce in environmental sustainability practices and encourage the adoption of greener technologies.
